Waverly Health Center - Leading the Way

Everyone has their own unique health journey. Whether someone is seeking to maintain good health or when they need additional care, Waverly Health Center (WHC) provides high-quality health care to meet individual needs. As the community's locally owned hospital, WHC provides a premier health experience close to home.

"While the past three years have brought significant challenges and transformation, WHC has remained focused on meeting the changing needs of our area," said Jodi Geerts, WHC chief executive officer. "Following the completion of the building project, we have been able to focus more on our processes and address areas to further strengthen our services."

Leading in Technology and Services

New MRI technology was introduced in August 2023. The new equipment offers sharper imaging, reduced scan times, more room for patients and more imaging options. "This is the leading MRI technology out there right now," said Dory Frericks, WHC radiology manager. "We are fortunate to provide comfortable and detailed imaging right here in Waverly."

The Center for Pediatric Therapies opened in October 2023. The center supports the growth and development needs of children, especially those with disabilities and other developmental challenges. Taylor Therapy's specialized pediatric team provides physical, occupational and speech therapy. The center features a state-of-the-art sensory gym, private therapy rooms, play equipment, a dedicated waiting room and a convenient location right inside the red entrance.

In addition to the new services and technology, WHC welcomed eleven new providers, including two providers in the Women's Clinic. Leading the way in women's health, the Women's Clinic provides obstetrics, gynecology and urogynecology services for women from adolescence through menopause.

Leading in Patient Experience

In July, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) updated its Overall Hospital Quality Star Ratings for 2023. A total of 483 hospitals in the U.S. were awarded a rating of five stars. WHC was one of eight hospitals in Iowa to achieve a five-star rating.

WHC was named as one of the best-in-state hospitals by Newsweek. Of the 600 hospitals on the list, WHC is one of 13 Iowa hospitals recognized for 2024. The health center also received a patient satisfaction award.

"Our values as an organization center on compassion, enthusiasm, excellence, innovation, integrity and leadership," said Geerts. "We have built a culture on these principles, which is reflected in our high patient satisfaction ratings. It takes each member of our team working together to be the local, trusted choice for health care needs."

Leading into the Future

Two long-standing leaders retired from the Board of Trustees at the close of 2023. John Johnston and Susan Vallem offered a combined 78 years of service to the hospital. Two new trustees were elected to the board. Jeff Meyers and Dr. David Rathe began their terms in January 2024.

"It is our privilege to provide high-quality health care services to the members of our community," said Geerts. "This is not something we take lightly. We are proud of the strides made this past year with the expanded services, outstanding providers and staff, and new equipment and technology. These changes involve significant capital investments and demonstrate our commitment to continuing to improve the delivery of health care services in our community. We look forward to serving the area in new and innovative ways in the year to come."



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Heart Attack Survivor Credits Success to WHC's Program

When Donald Wood of Shell Rock had severe shoulder pain for several hours and it began spreading to his neck, back and chest, he and his wife Julie decided to get it checked out at Waverly Health Center's (WHC) Walk-In Clinic. Donald was quickly transferred to the emergency department. Doctors there discovered he was having a heart attack.

Donald was airlifted to another facility for urgent cardiac care. The cardiologists determined that Donald's heart attack included 70, 80 and 90 percent blockages of five different vessels. He opted to have coronary artery bypass graft (CABG) surgery. CABG is a procedure that uses healthy blood vessels to bypass a blockage caused by coronary artery disease.

Three weeks after his heart attack, Donald was recovering at home and was ready to begin cardiac rehabilitation at WHC. Cardiac rehab is a personalized, supervised program to help patients who have heart problems understand their diagnosis and treatment. It enables them to improve their heart function and safely return to daily activities.

"I walked into cardiac rehab feeling like a 115-year-old," said Donald. "After the first few sessions, I started to feel better."

He participated in rehab sessions three times per week for two months. After substantial improvement and surpassing all goals, he graduated from the program.

Donald noted that the three nurses in cardiac rehab – Michelle, Nikki and Rebecca – were always by his side, monitoring his heart and making him feel comfortable. He appreciated their professionalism, and how friendly and knowledgeable they were.

"I put in the work, but they were able to motivate me in such a way that I was looking forward to each session," said Donald.

Now exercising daily at home, Donald is in better shape than he was before his heart attack.

"I credit the cardiac rehab team just as much as I do myself for the quick advancement and recovery of my entire cardiovascular system."

A comprehensive cardiac rehabilitation program has been proven effective at improving heart function and lowering the risk of future heart events or death.

Positive Experience at WHC Despite Challenging Pregnancy

For Shelby Sebring of Hawkeye, news that baby number three was on the way brought a flood of emotions. Excitement, for a third blessing and another sibling for big brother Benton and big sister Henley. Nervousness, because she would likely experience a tough pregnancy like her first two.

Throughout her three pregnancies, Shelby suffered from hyperemesis gravidarum (HG). HG is an extreme form of morning sickness. It causes severe nausea and vomiting during pregnancy. HG can lead to dehydration, fatigue or weight loss. Unlike morning sickness, HG can last throughout the entire pregnancy – which was the case for Shelby.

"After finding out I had HG again I will very scared," said Shelby. "You never know how severe HG will be or how long it will last."

Shelby began treating her HG with oral medication. That didn't help due to her consistent vomiting. She then began receiving treatments at Waverly Health Center's (WHC) Outpatient Medical Services (OPM) around 12 weeks pregnant. Her treatments included hydration, vitamin bags and potassium, as needed. She did this twice per week throughout the remainder of her pregnancy.

Shelby was glad she chose treatment at WHC because she always felt welcomed.

"My birthing experiences, the outpatient nurses and our kids' pediatrician have always made us feel like we are home," she said. "The atmosphere there was happy, energetic, warming and just very friendly." she said.

Shelby delivered a healthy baby girl named Madelyn. They later visited the nurses in OPM to thank them for the care they received.

"I honestly felt like every single one of those nurses are my family," Shelby said. "I couldn't ask for better care and support than what I got!"
