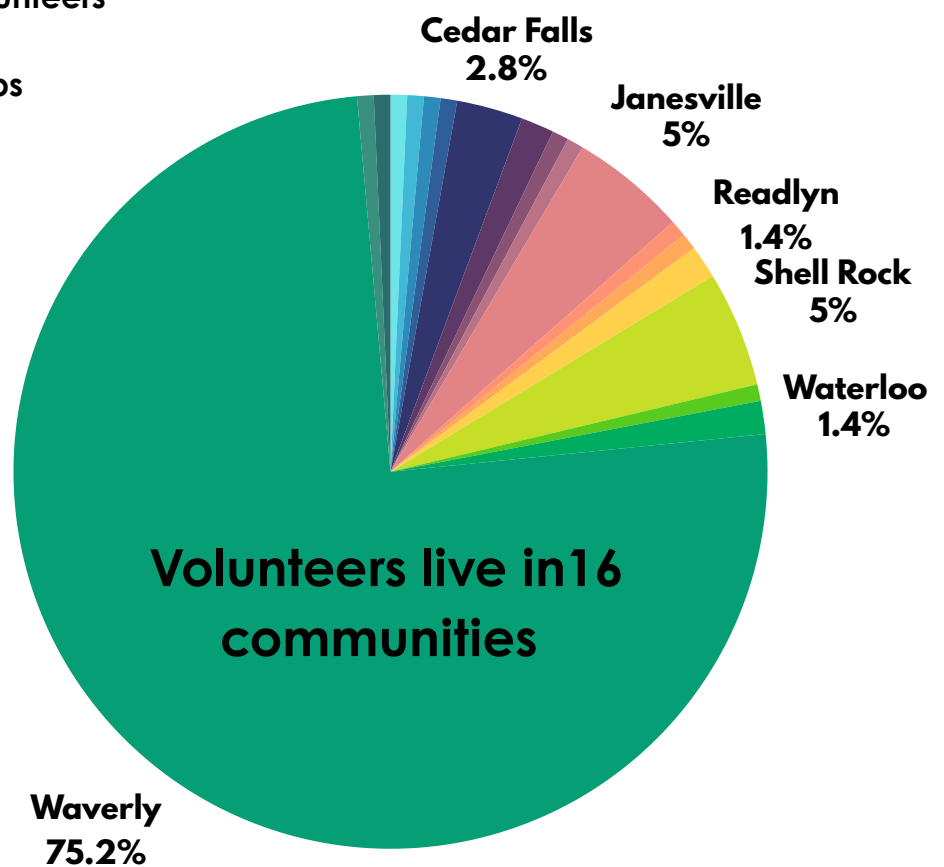

 - 3 Auxiliary Card Clubs



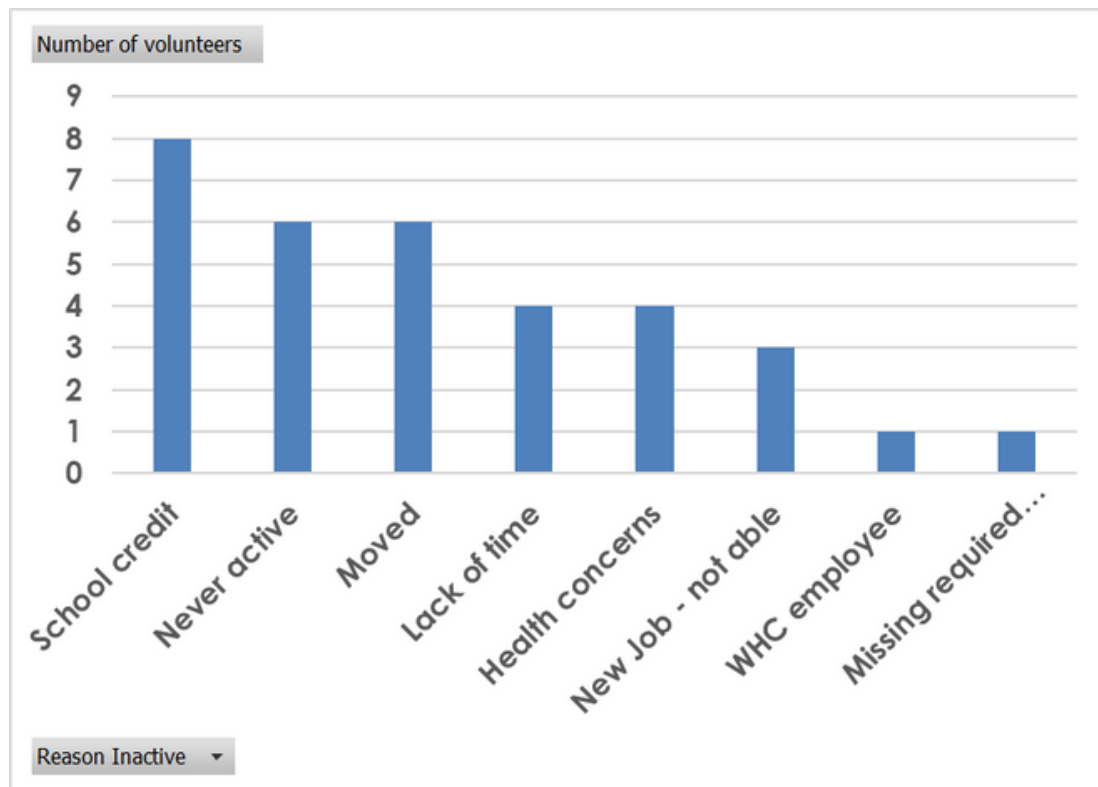
Statistics

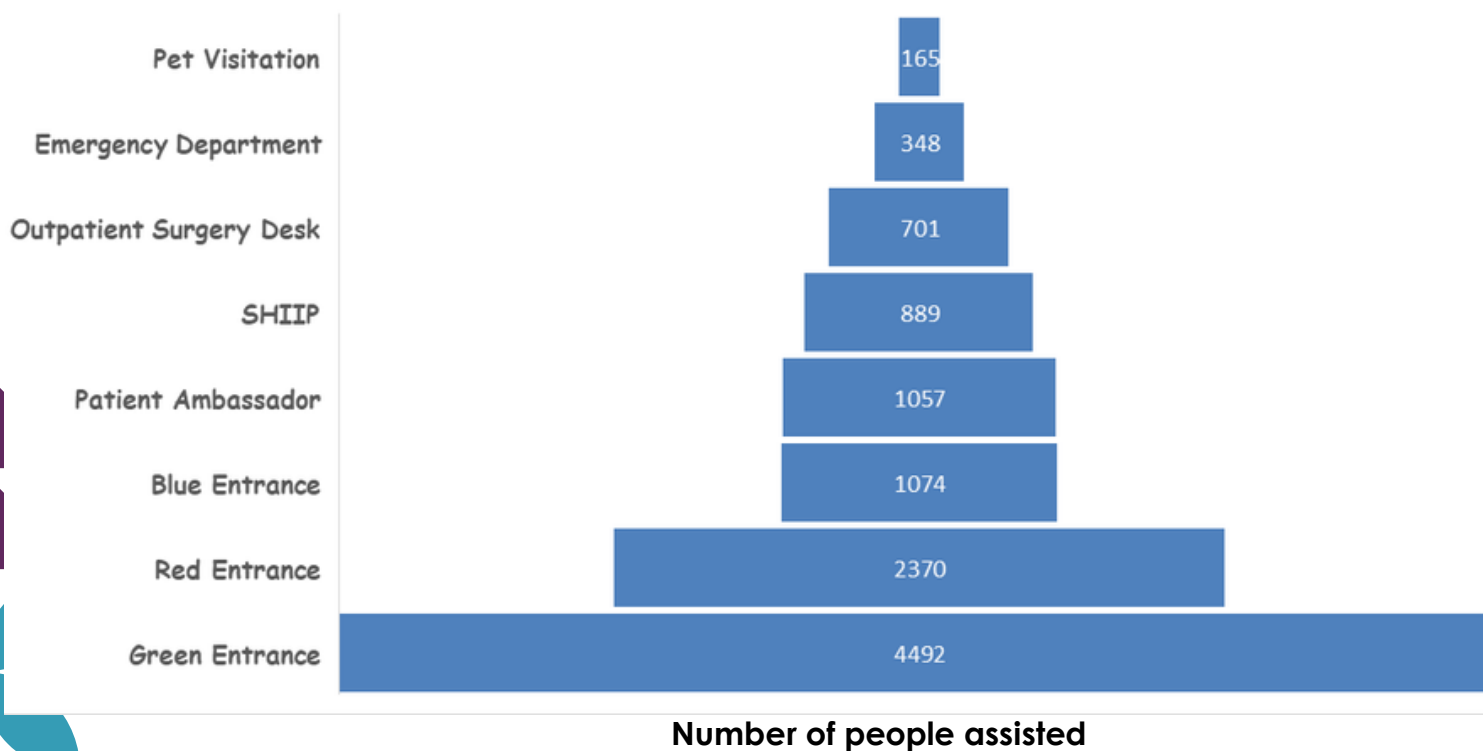
13048 hours X \$34.79= \$453,939.92 in financial impact to Waverly Health Center

SHIIP - Senior Health Insurance Information Program

Waverly Health Center has partnered with the State of Iowa Insurance Division to sponsor the Senior Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP) for Bremer County and the surrounding area. The program has eight trained volunteers who provide free, confidential counseling and information to individuals with questions about Medicare. Open enrollment is October 15 - December 7.
